



Cisco BLOODHOUND SSC Global Video Competition

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Introduction

The Cisco BLOODHOUND SSC Global Video Competition is designed to offer an opportunity for young people to demonstrate their skills in Creative and Digital Media and to share their skills and understanding of the BLOODHOUND SSC Project. The competition hopes to build a bank of short, informative films that can be shared with the rest of the BLOODHOUND Education Community and gives students an opportunity to research, direct, film, present and develop pre and post production skills using the best technology and software available to schools and colleges.

There are four entry categories for the competition that are open to any school or college via the BLOODHOUND SSC website <http://www.bloodhoundssc.com/ciscovideocomp> or BLOODHOUND BLAST <https://dendrite.org.uk/topics/3847>. For entries where the pupils cross the Key Stages (e.g. from an Afterschool Club) the oldest pupil's age should be used. Teams should be no more than 6 pupils or students.

Primary (Age 5-11 years)
Senior (Age 11-14 years)
Senior (Age 14- 16)
Post 16 Learner (Age 16+)

Video narrative should be in English but if you would like to use your own Language send a translation with your entry (or add subtitles).

Judging

The Judging Panel will consist of Project Director, Richard Noble, Cisco TV representative, BLOODHOUND TV artist, Stefan Marjoram and a member of the Education Team.

The Prizes

The winning team in each Category will receive one half day's worth of instruction from leading film maker Stefan Marjoram, previously Creative Director for Aardman Animations where he made TV ads, idents and short films.

The winning teams will also be given an opportunity to undertake a video interview with Project Director, Richard Noble and other members of the BLOODHOUND Team.

The winning videos will be showcased on www.bloodhoundssc.com and the relevant www.bloodhoundblast.com communities with a global reach into 216 countries and territories throughout the World and will be promoted through Newsletters, Tweets and Facebook.



Overall Winner

This is a truly unique prize for our Cisco BLOODHOUND SSC Global Video Competition. The overall winning team will be invited (at their own cost), as guests of BLOODHOUND SSC, to watch one of the UK Test runs (date to be confirmed, but proposed mid - late 2015) where they will be given the opportunity to be national and international media crews that will film the run and interview the Team. Escorted by a teacher/lecturer and a BLOODHOUND Education Team Member, the winners will have unrivalled access to the "behind the scenes" preparation to the run.

Content and Production Guidance

To give teams a little guidance on what the Judging Panel will be looking for (see Judging Criteria for more details).

Any aspect of the project will be suitable for the video. Check <https://dendrite.org.uk/topics/3847> for some video content ideas.

Pick a topic about the project that excites your Team. If you are excited about the topic, this will feed through to your video and make it more engaging.

Check BHTV (<https://dendrite.org.uk/topics/3847> BLOODHOUND TV Episode 9) to get a look and feel of what a short video can do to inform and educate. Have a look at other film media outlets for production ideas.

Don't be afraid to try something new or innovative; The BLOODHOUND Team does this every day while developing the Car. Breaking boundaries and convention is how we move forward with the use of technology. Why not do the same!

Collaborate! BLOODHOUND SSC collaborates with over 250 experts in their field. If you have access to experts, get their support (but don't let them take over!). There are lots of Film Makers that would be happy to help schools and Colleges.

Make the video exciting and interesting. Your video might be viewed by a Global audience; DONT BORE THEM (or the Judges).

Make an Animation; using your imagination you can make a video which pushes and develops ideas way beyond that of traditional video content.

Have Fun – if you are having fun in the production of your video, this will show in your final submission.

The Rules

The Cisco BLOODHOUND SSC Video Competition is open to any school or college registered with the BLOODHOUND Education Programme. There are four categories of entry and teams should be no more than 6 pupils or students.

Primary (Age 5-11 years)
Senior (Age 11-14 years)
Senior (Age 14- 16)
Post 16 Learner (Age 16+)

The entry can be a video or animation about an element of the BLOODHOUND SSC project. All the relevant information for your video is available at <http://www.bloodhoundssc.com/ciscovideocomp> and for those registered on BLOODHOUND BLAST, here <https://dendrite.org.uk/topics/3847>

You might choose to video a BLOODHOUND Education session that has been held in your school and add a narrative over the video. You might want to explore a different facet of the project (rocket, jet, wheels, structure, aerodynamics, control systems, life in the desert etc). You may want to video pupils using the Educational Resources or an experiment that might demonstrate a different element of the Project.

The key to a successful video is to make it interesting, fun (perhaps), informative (not boring), colourful, engaging and should immediately make impact on the audience (and Judges). A Judging Matrix is attached.

Your video should be approximately 3 minutes (plus or minus 20 seconds) in length excluding the closing credits. Within the first 20-30 seconds of your video, you should clearly state the BLOODHOUND/STEM concept you are demonstrating.

The video can be in the following formats: .mov, .mp4, .wmv, .avi, .vob, .m4v

All content in your video must be original work created by YOU or somebody on your team. Any other content in the video (images, music, clipart, sound effects, video) should be credited where necessary. Please feel free to use BLOODHOUND SSC animations.

Your video must contain closing credits where you give proper credit to all your Team and any creators who contributed.

Do not submit a video that makes fun of someone, is mean spirited or could be viewed as bullying.

Your video must be suitable to be shown to every school age person (though the content can be as technical as you like) so use of language, images etc should be appropriate.

The BLOODHOUND Education Programme may wish to include video of your students participating in the Cisco BLOODHOUND SSC Global Video Competition, which may be publicly available to stream on the example platforms above and on the BLOODHOUND Education Programme's website www.bloodhoundssc.com or www.bloodhoundblast.com Videos may be used to promote the Educational aims of BLOODHOUND Education Programme throughout the lifetime of the Project and beyond.
